THE OFFICE OF TENEBRAE FOR MAUNDY THURSDAY Sung on the Night of Spy Wednesday

The sanctuary is prepared in the usual manner. The 15 candle Tenebrae Hearse is set in the sanctuary on the epistle side, the candles lighted, as are also the six High Mass candles. The lower 14 candles are extinguished individually one by one after the recitation of each of the 14 Psalms of Matins and Lauds as indicated herein. The six High Mass candles are extinguished during the Benedictus.

The Clergy and ministers, vested in cassock and surplice or religious habit, enter the sanctuary in silence, proceed to their places, kneel and silently say the following prayers of preparation after which they take their seats to await the beginning of the office.

Our Father, Who art in Heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth, as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Hail Mary, full of Grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst women, and blessed is the Fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and in the hour of our death. Amen.

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of Heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord. Who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary; suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into Hell. On the third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into Heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Ghost, the Holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

The Office opens immediately with the Antiphon of the first Psalm of Tenebrae.

Let not them be ashamed for me : who look for thee, O Lord, the Lord of hosts.

Let them not be confounded on my account : who seek thee, O God of Israel.

Because for thy sake I have borne reproach : shame hath covered my face.

I am become a stranger to my brethren : and an alien to the sons of my mother.

For the zeal of thy house hath eaten me up: and the reproaches of them that reproached thee are fallen upon me.

And I covered my soul in fasting : and it was made a reproach to me.

And I made haircloth my garment : and I became a byword to them.

They that sat in the gate spoke against me : and they that drank wine made me their song.

But as for me, my prayer is to thee, O Lord: for the time of thy good pleasure, O God.

In the multitude of thy mercy hear me : in the truth of thy salvation.

Draw me out of the mire, that I may not stick fast: deliver me from them that hate me, and out of the deep waters.

Let not the tempest of water drown me, nor the deep swallow me up: and let not the pit shut her mouth upon me.

Hear me, O Lord, for thy mercy is kind: look upon me according to the multitude of thy tender mercies.

And turn not away thy face from thy servant : for I am in trouble, hear me speedily.

Attend to my soul, and deliver it : save me because of my enemies.

Thou knowest my reproach, and my confusion: and my shame.

INCIPIT OF THE LAMENTATIONS OF JEREMIADS THE PROPHET

Lamentations of Jeremias 1: 1-14

First Lesson

Aleph. How doth the city sit solitary that was full of people! how is the mistress of the Gentiles become as a widow: the princes of provinces made tributary!

A READING FROM THE TREATISE OF SAINT AUGUSTINE THE BISHOP ON THE PSALMS

On Psalm 54

Fourth Lesson

"Hear my prayer, O God; do not hide yourself from my petition. Listen to me and answer me. I mourn in my trial and am troubled." These are the words of one disquieted, in trouble and anxiety. He prays under much suffering, desiring to be delivered from evil. Let us now see under what evil he lies; and when he begins to speak. let us place ourselves beside him, that, by sharing his tribulation, we may also join in his prayer. "I mourn in my trial," he says, "and am troubled." When does he mourn? When is he troubled? He says, "In my trial." He has in mind the wicked who cause him suffering, and he calls this suffering his "trial." Do not think that the evil are in the world for no purpose, and that God makes no good use of them. Every wicked person lives either that he may be corrected, or that through him the righteous may be tried and tested.

Responsory: Tamquam ad latronem

- **R.** Ye are come as against a thief, with swords and clubs to take me: * I was daily with you, in the temple teaching, and ye held me not; and lo: even after I have been scourged, ye lead me to be crucified.
- **V.** And when they had laid hands on Jesus and taken him, he said to them: * I was daily with you, in the temple teaching, and ye held me not.

Fifth Lesson

Would that those who now test us were converted and tried with us; yet though they continue to try us, let us not hate them, for we do not know whether any of them will persist to the end in their evil ways. And most of the time, when you think you are hating your enemy, you are hating your brother without knowing it. Only the devil and his angels are shown to us in the Holy Scriptures as doomed to eternal fire. It is only their amendment that is hopeless, and against them we wage a hidden battle. For this battle the Apostle arms us, saying, "We are not contending against flesh and blood," that is, not against human beings whom we see, "but against the principalities, against the powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world." So that you may not think that demons are the rulers of heaven and earth, he says, "of the darkness of this world." He says, "of the world," meaning the lovers of the world -- of the "world," meaning the ungodly and wicked -- the "world" of which the Gospel says, "And the world knew him not."

Responsory: Tenebrae factae sunt

R. Darkness covered the earth whilst the Jews crucified Jesus: and about the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice: My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me? * And bowing his head he gave up the ghost.

Sixth Lesson

"For I have seen unrighteousness and strife in the city." See the glory of the cross itself. On the brow of kings that cross is now placed, the cross which enemies once mocked. Its power is shown in the result. He has conquered the world, not by steel, but by wood. The wood of the cross seemed a fitting object of scorn to his enemies, and standing before that wood they wagged their heads, saying, "If you are the Son of God, come down from the cross." He stretched out his hands to an unbelieving and rebellious people. If one is just who lives by faith, one who does not have faith is unrighteous. Therefore when he says "unrighteousness," understand that it is unbelief. The Lord then saw unrighteousness and strife in the city, and stretched out his hands to an unbelieving and rebellious people. And yet, looking upon them, he said, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do."

FROM THE EPISTLE OF THE BLESSED APOSTLE PAUL TO THE HEBREWS

Hebrews 4:11-5:10

Seventh Lesson

Let us hasten therefore to enter into that rest; lest any man fall into the same example of unbelief. For the word of God is living and effectual, and more piercing than any two edged sword; and reaching unto the division of the soul and the spirit, of the joints also and the marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart. Neither is there any creature invisible in his sight: but all things are naked and open to his eyes, to whom our speech is. Having therefore a great high priest that hath passed into the heavens, Jesus the Son of God: let us hold fast our confession. For we have not a high priest, who cannot have compassion on our infirmities: but one tempted in all things like as we are, without sin.

Responsory: Eram quasi agnus

- **R.** I was like an innocent lamb; I was led to the sacrifice, and I knew it not; my enemies had conspired against me, saying: * Come let us put wood into his bread, and root him out of the land of the living.

Eighth Lesson

Let us go therefore with confidence to the throne of grace: that we may obtain mercy, and find grace in seasonable aid. For every high priest taken from among men, is ordained for men in the things that appertain to God, that he may offer up gifts and sacrifices for sins: Who can have compassion on them that are ignorant and that err: because he himself also is compassed with infirmity. And therefore he ought, as for the people, so also for himself, to offer for sins.

Ninth Lesson

Neither doth any man take the honor to himself, but he that is called by God, as Aaron was. So Christ also did not glorify himself, that he might be made a high priest: but he that said unto him: Thou art my Son, this day have I begotten thee. As he saith also in another place: Thou art a priest forever, according to the order of Melchisedech. Who in the days of his flesh, with a strong cry and tears, offering up prayers and supplications to him that was able to save him from death, was heard for his reverence. And whereas indeed he was the Son of God, he learned obedience by the things which he suffered: And being consummated, he became, to all that obey him, the cause of eternal salvation; called by God a high priest according to the order of Melchisedech.

For in thy wrath we have fainted away: and are troubled in thy indignation.

Thou hast set our iniquities before thy eyes : our life in the light of thy countenance.

For all our days are spent : and in thy wrath we have fainted away.

Our years shall be considered as a spider: the days of our years in them are threescore and ten years.

But if in the strong they be fourscore years : and what is more of them is labor and sorrow.

For mildness is come upon us : and we shall be corrected.

Who knoweth the power of thy anger: and for thy fear can number thy wrath?

So make thy right hand known: and men learned in heart, in wisdom.

Return, O Lord, how long? : and be entreated in favor of thy servants.

We are filled in the morning with thy mercy: and we have rejoiced, and are delighted all our days.

We have rejoiced for the days in which thou hast humbled us: for the years in which we have seen evils.

Look upon thy servants and upon their works: and direct their children.

And let the brightness of the Lord our God be upon us: and direct thou the works of our hands over us: yea, the work of our hands do thou direct.

Hear, O Lord, my prayer, give ear to my supplication in thy truth: hear me in thy justice.

And enter not into judgment with thy servant : for in thy sight no man living shall be justified.

For the enemy hath persecuted my soul: he hath brought down my life to the earth.

He hath made me to dwell in darkness as those that have been dead of old: and my spirit is in anguish within me: my heart within me is troubled. I remembered the days of old, I meditated on all thy works: I meditated upon the works of thy hands.

I stretched forth my hands to thee: my soul is as earth without water unto thee.

Hear me speedily, O Lord: my spirit hath fainted away.

Turn not away thy face from me : lest I be like unto them that go down into the pit.

Cause me to hear thy mercy in the morning: for in thee have I hoped.

Make the way known to me, wherein I should walk : for I have lifted up my soul to thee.

Deliver me from my enemies, O Lord, : to thee have I fled.

Teach me to do thy will: for thou art my God.

Thy good spirit shall lead me into the right land: for thy name's sake, O Lord, thou wilt quicken me in thy justice.

Canticle of Ezechias: *Isaiah 38: 10-20*

I said, In the midst of my days: I shall go to the gates of hell.

I sought for the residue of my years: I said, I shall not see the Lord God in the land of the living.

I shall behold man no more: nor the inhabitant of rest.

My generation is at an end, and it is rolled away from me: as a shepherd's tent.

My life is cut off, as by a weaver, whilst I was yet but beginning, he cut me off: from morning even to night thou wilt make an end of me.

I hoped till morning: as a lion so hath he broken all my bones.

From morning even to night thou wilt make an end of me: I will cry like a young swallow, I will meditate like a dove. My eyes are weakened: with looking upward.

Lord, I suffer violence, answer thou for me: What shall I say, or what shall he answer for me, whereas he himself hath done it?

I will recount to thee all my years : in the bitterness of my soul.

O Lord, if man's life be such, and the life of my spirit be in such things as these: thou shalt correct me, and make me to live.

Behold in peace is my bitterness most bitter: but thou best delivered my soul that it should not perish, thou hast cast all my sins behind thy back.

For hell shall not confess to thee, neither shall death praise thee: nor shall they that go down into the pit, look for thy truth.

The living, the living, he shall give praise to thee, as I do this day: the father shall make thy truth known to the children.

O Lord, save me: and we will sing our psalms all the days of our life in the house of the Lord.

PSALM 150

Praise ye the Lord in his holy places: praise ye him in the firmament of his power.

Praise ye him for his mighty acts: praise ye him according to the multitude of his greatness.

Praise him with sound of trumpet: praise him with psaltery and harp.

Praise him with timbrel and choir : praise him with strings and organs.

Praise him on high sounding cymbals, praise him on cymbals of joy: let every spirit praise the Lord.

ANT. 5 O death, I will be thy death; O grave, I will be thy destruction.

R. Thou wilt not let thy Holy One see corruption.

ANT. Now the women sitting at the tomb made lamentation, weeping for the Lord.

All the church lights are now extinguished. The six High Mass candles are put out during the Canticle of Zachary as follows.

The Canticle of Zachary

Blessed be the Lord God of Israel: because he hath visited and wrought the redemption of His people.

And hath raised up an horn of salvation to us: in the house of David his servant.

As he spoke by the mouth of his holy prophets; who are from the beginning.

Salvation from our enemies : and from the hand of all that hate us.

To perform mercy to our fathers : and to remember his holy testament.

The oath, which he swore to Abraham our father: that he would grant to us.

That being delivered from the hand of our enemies : we may serve him without fear.

In holiness and justice before him: all our days.

And thou, child, shalt be called the prophet of the Highest: for thou shalt go before the face of the Lord to prepare his ways.

To give knowledge of salvation to his people: unto the remission of their sins.

Through the tender mercy of our God: by which the Orient from on high hath visited us.

To enlighten them that sit in darkness, and in the shadow of death: to direct our feet into the way of peace.

During the singing/reading of this final Antiphon, the last remaining lighted candle (the one at the peak of the Tenebrae Hearse, representing Our Lord Jesus Christ) is now removed and hidden behind the epistle side of the altar or in some other convenient place to indicate His death and burial.

ANT. Now the women sitting at the tomb made lamentation, weeping for the Lord.

All now kneel and the following versicle is sung or said.

Christ humbled Himself, becoming obedient unto death, even to the death of the cross; For which cause God also hath highly exalted Him, and hath given Him a Name which is above all names.

Then is said silently the Our Father.

Then in an audible but low voice the Psalm Miserere is said by all.

PSALM 50: The Miserere Mei, Deus

Have mercy on me, O God, according to Thy great mercy. According to the multitude of Thy tender mercies blot out my iniquity.

Wash me yet more thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin.

For I know my iniquity, and my sin is always before me.

Against Thee only have I sinned, and done evil in Thy sight: that Thou mayest be justified in Thy words and mayest overcome when Thou art judged.

For behold I was conceived in iniquity; and in sin did my mother conceive me.

For behold Thou hast loved truth: the uncertain and hidden things of Thy wisdom Thou hast made manifest to me.

Thou shalt sprinkle me with hyssop, and I shall be cleansed: Thou shalt wash me, and I shall be made whiter than snow.

Thou shalt make me to hear joy and gladness: and the bones that have been humbled shall rejoice.

Turn away Thy face from my sins, and blot out all my iniquities.

Create a clean heart in me, O God: and renew a right spirit within my bosom.

Cast me not away from Thy face; and take not Thy Holy Spirit from me.

Restore unto me the joy of Thy salvation, and strengthen me with a perfect spirit.

I will teach the unjust, Thy ways: and the wicked shall be converted unto Thee.

Deliver me from blood-guiltiness, O God, Thou God of my salvation: and my tongue shall extol Thy justice.

O Lord, Thou wilt open my lips: and my mouth shall declare Thy praise.

For if Thou hadst desired sacrifice, I would indeed have given it: with burnt offerings Thou wilt not be satisfied.

A sacrifice to God is an afflicted spirit: a contrite and humbled heart, O God, Thou wilt not despise.

Deal favorably, O Lord, in Thy good will with Sion; that the walls of Jerusalem may be built up.

Then shalt Thou accept the sacrifice of justice, oblations and whole burnt offerings: then shall they lay young bullocks upon Thine altar.

The Celebrant now reads in an audible but low and humble voice the following Collect, without the usual greeting:

Collect

Look down, we beseech Thee, O Lord, upon this Thy family, for which our Lord Jesus Christ was willing to be delivered into the hands of the wicked, and to undergo the torment of the Cross. [he adds silently...Who now livest and reignest with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever one God, world without end. Amen.]

A loud noise, known as the "strepitus" is now made [usually by slamming books closed or against the pews] to represent the earthquake at the death of Our Lord and the closing of His tomb.

In silence the lighted candle which had previously been hidden behind the altar, now symbolic of the Risen Lord rising from the dead and conquering death, is returned to its prominent position at the peak of the Tenebrae Hearse, and everyone leaves the church in silence.
